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Acknowledgement of Traditional Territories

Algoma University respectfully acknowledges that its three campuses are located on the inherent and treaty lands of First Nations and within traditional lands of Indigenous peoples. For thousands of years, Indigenous peoples inhabited and cared for this land, and continue to do so today.

The Sault Ste. Marie campus is located in an area known as Baawaating on sacred lands set aside for education as envisioned by Chief Shingwauk for our children and for those as yet unborn. Located in Robinson-Huron Treaty territory, this land is the traditional territory of the Anishinaabek, specifically the Garden River and Batchewana First Nations, as well as Métis People. Sault Ste. Marie is also home to several urban Indigenous peoples.

We also acknowledge that; The Brampton campus is part of the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. In particular we acknowledge the territory of the Anishinabeg particularly the, Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee and Ojibway/Chippewa peoples; the land that is home to the Métis; and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation who are direct descendants of the Mississaugas of the Credit.

We also acknowledge that; The Timmins campus is located on Treaty #9 territory, also known as the James Bay Treaty. It is the traditional territory of the Ojibwe/Chippewa, including the Mattagami First Nation, as well as the Mushkegowuk (Cree), Algonquin, and Métis Peoples.

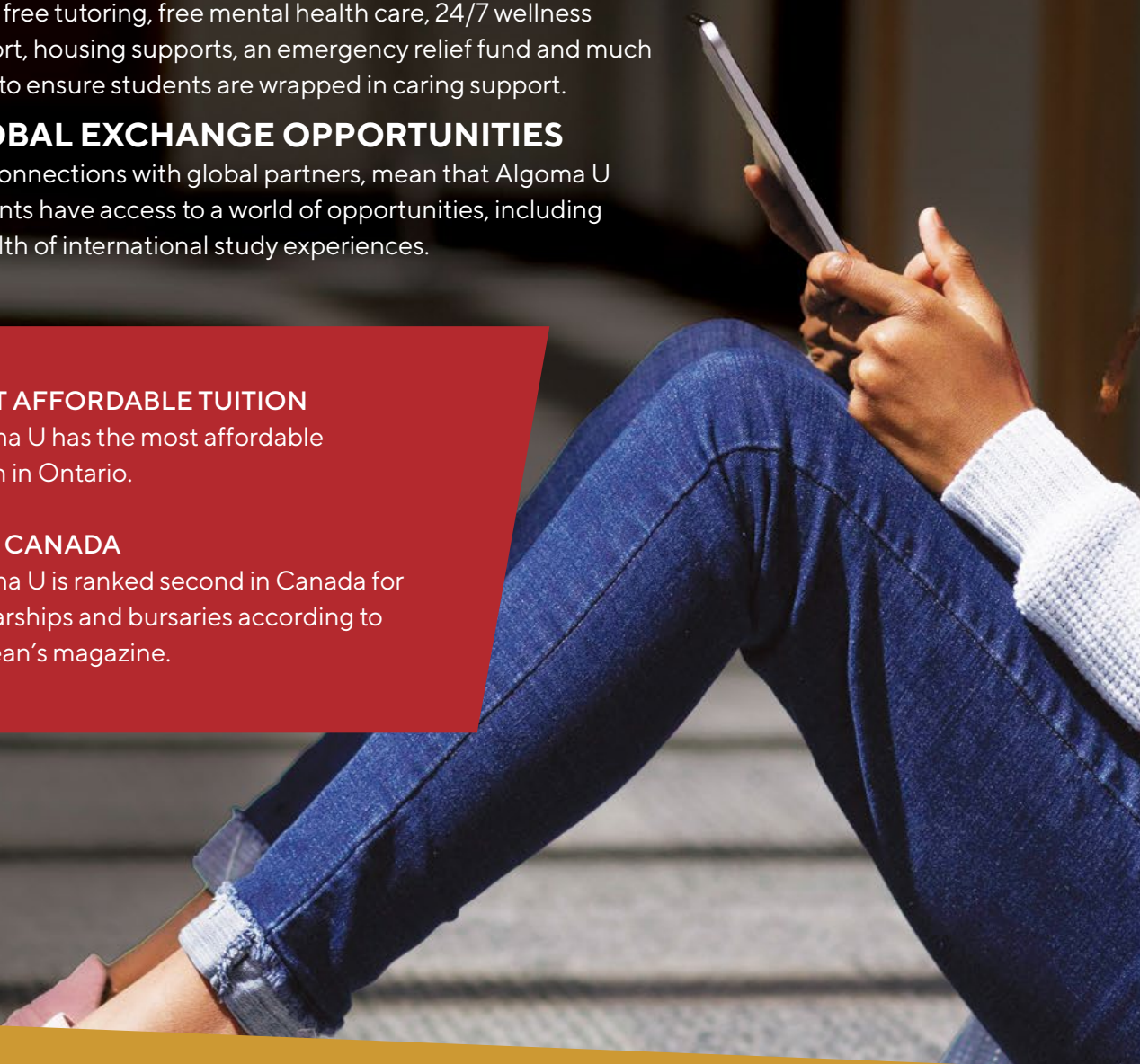

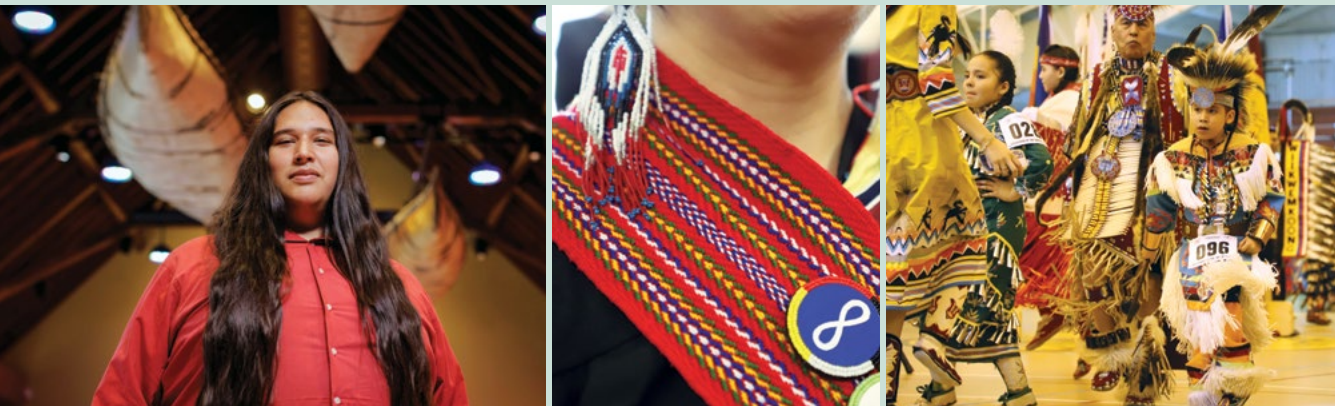

These teachings guide us, reminding us of our responsibilities to the world, to others around us and to ourselves.



ANISHINAABE EDUCATION

The spirit of sharing and coming together continues on our campuses today. Algoma U's Sault Ste. Marie campus, located on the former Shingwauk Indian Residential School site, offers a unique and historically rich setting for a cross-cultural community in which Anishinaabe (First Nations, Métis, and Inuit), Canadian, and international students and faculty learn with each other and from one another in a spirit of friendship and respect. We emulate this approach in Brampton and Timmins.

VOLUNTARY SELF-IDENTIFICATION

At Algoma U, 'Anishinaabe' is an inclusive term for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit peoples, honouring the Ojibwe language traditional to this territory. Students can voluntarily declare their First Nations, Métis, or Inuit status:

- When applying through the Ontario Universities Application Centre (OUAC)
- When applying directly to Algoma U
- After acceptance, by completing the Voluntary Aboriginal Self-Identification survey on their AU student portal

By self-identifying, students receive information about community events, academic workshops, scholarships, bursaries, employment opportunities, and cultural activities.

SHORT-TERM INTERNATIONAL LEARNING

Algoma University offers innovative, short-term international experiences in which students travel as a group to international destinations for 1-3 weeks to complete an academic course. Students have traveled to Italy, Belgium, Spain, Guatemala, Colombia, Belize, and India to engage in hands-on experiential learning related to their academic discipline. Experiences in the past have included an Indigenous cultural exchange focused on Mayan and Garifuna Architecture, Ethnomedicine, and Astronomy and a course on the global rise of democracy in India where students visited numerous NGOs and officials with the World Bank, Canadian High Commission, and the TATA Group.

QUEEN ELIZABETH SCHOLARS (QES) PROGRAM

Queen Elizabeth Scholars engage with community, learn about culture, and work on projects and actions with a global impact. Queen Elizabeth Scholars become part of a global network of scholars who share knowledge, exchange ideas, and collaborate on meaningful initiatives. Algoma University's QES project is focused on community-based experiences to advance decolonization and cross-cultural education. Queen Elizabeth Scholars from Algoma University will engage in study, research, or an internship abroad for a minimum of two months, as well as engage in community work locally and internationally.

BIOLOGY

In our Biology program, you will take courses that will teach you the scientific method, and how to use it. Our program takes a problem-solving approach to the sciences, preparing students for life in general, but also for graduate studies. 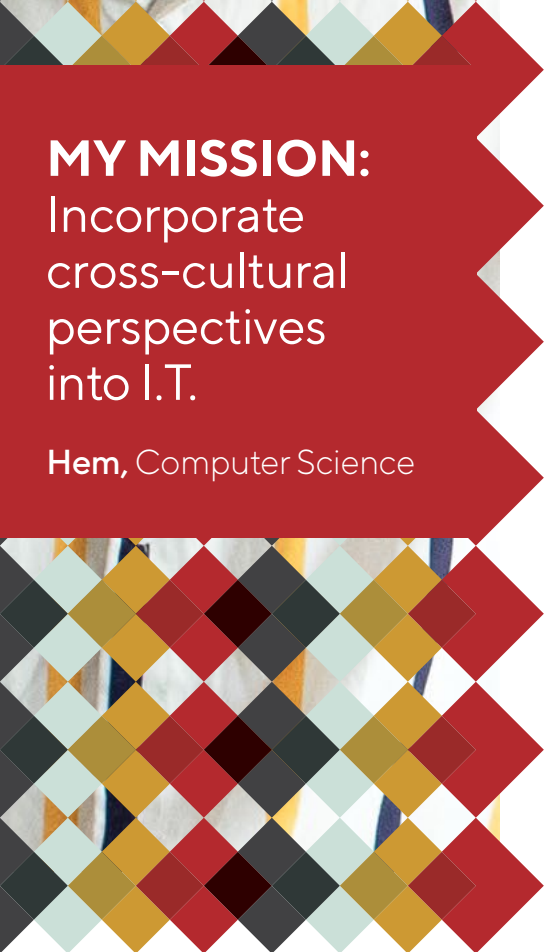
