MEMO: Important Algoma University Campus Updates

Today, the Ontario Government has <u>announced</u> a further extension on the previous orders in place, as announced in the April 16, 2021 <u>communication</u>.

The province is to remain in lockdown until June 2, 2021.

The **Brampton Campus** will remain closed during this period. Employees will continue to work from home (except in emergencies), and students will not have access to the campus. Should employees need access to campus please email <u>yuka.yamada@algomau.ca</u>)

Those studying and working at Algoma's **Timmins Campus** will follow Northern College's <u>direction</u> on closures and use of space.

For the **Sault Ste. Marie Campus**, all measures outlined in the <u>April 16th</u> communication memo remain in effect including:

- All non-essential employees will be required to work from home
- One-off visits can be requested by emailing <u>covid@algomau.ca</u>; for faculty, please cc <u>dean@algomau.ca</u> as well
- Students will be able to book use in the computer lab(s) via IT Service
