MEMO: Important COVID-19 Updates

As we look towards the start of the new academic year and begin to welcome new and returning students, faculty and staff to all three of our campuses, we wanted to provide an important update regarding pandemic-related health and safety on campus this fall.

The University continues to closely monitor and follow the direction of the Public Health teams where all three of our campuses are located (<u>Algoma Public Health</u>, <u>Peel Public Health</u>, <u>Porcupine Public Health</u>).

The Algoma University community has done a tremendous job in keeping each other safe throughout the course of the pandemic. We are excited to welcome students back to campus, to in-person learning and events. In order to keep each other safe during this time, we ask everyone to follow a few simple steps:

- 1. Continue to self-monitor and screen for symptoms before coming to campus. If you are feeling unwell, stay home and get well!
