

Acknowledgement of **Traditional Territories**

Algoma University respectfully acknowledges that its three campuses are located on the inherent and treaty lands of First Nations and within traditional lands of Indigenous peoples. For thousands of years, Indigenous peoples inhabited and cared for this land, and continue to do so today.

The Sault Ste. Marie campus is located in an area known as Baawaating on sacred lands set aside for education as envisioned by Chief Shingwauk for our children and for those as yet unborn. Located in Robinson-Huron Treaty territory, this land is the traditional territory of the Anishinaabek, specifically the Garden River and Batchewana First Nations, as well as Métis People. Sault Ste. Marie is also home to several urban Indigenous peoples.

We also acknowledge that; The Brampton campus is part of the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. In particular we acknowledge the territory of the Anishinabeg particularly the, Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee and Ojibway/Chippewa peoples; the land that is home to the Métis; and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation who are direct descendants of the Mississaugas of the Credit.

We also acknowledge that; The Timmins campus is located on Treaty #9 territory, also known as the James Bay Treaty. It is the traditional territory of the Ojibwe/ Chippewa, including the Mattagami First Nation, as well as the Mushkegowuk (Cree), Algonquin, and Métis Peoples.



STUDY ONLINE OR IN-PERSON AT OUR SAULT STE. MARIE OR BRAMPTON CAMPUSES

Students who already hold a degree or diploma in a discipline other than computer science may be able to earn a Bachelor of Computer Science (General) or a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (General) in as little as 12 months, depending upon their previous credentials.

Additional Information: Students who complete the accelerated program can continue on to the fourth year of the program and earn a four-year honours degree. It is recommended that you speak to your faculty advisors early about this, so that you can properly plan your course progression in advance. Unsure if you're admissible? Algoma University now offers Graduate degree programs at the Master's level in Computer Science, Biology and Social Work.

MASTER OF COMPUTER SCIENCE

A one-year (three-semester) course-based Master's Program designed for Bachelor degree graduates in computer science, information technology and related areas. This program is being offered both in Sault Ste. Marie and Brampton in two yearly intakes, fall and winter. MASTER OF SCIENCE IN BIOLOGY

This research thesis-based program, offered over two-academic years, is designed for graduates of four-year Honours Bachelor of Science programs in the field of Life Sciences. Admission into this program is competitive and it requires prior research supervision approval from an Algoma University Faculty member. The program is offered at the Sault Ste. Marie campus each fall.

The MSW program has a strong and critical anti-oppressive, social justice, anti-racist approach, which is a social work area that is currently very active and has enormous potential in many social work sectors locally and internationally.
