Acknowledgement of Traditional Territories

Algoma University acknowledges that its three campuses are located on the traditional and treaty lands of Indigenous Peoples who have cared for these territories for generations.

Our **Sault Ste. Marie campus** sits in Baawaating, set aside for education as envisioned by Chief Shingwauk for our children and for those as yet unborn. Located in the Robinson-Huron Treaty territory, this land is the traditional territory of the Anishinaabek, specifically the Garden River and Batchewana First Nations, as well as Métis People. Sault Ste. Marie is also home to several urban Indigenous Peoples.

Our **Brampton campus** is part of the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. In particular we acknowledge the territory of the Anishinaabek, particularly the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee and Ojibwe/Chippewa Peoples; the land that is home to the Métis; and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation, who are direct descendants of the Mississaugas of the Credit.

Our **Timmins campus** is located on Treaty #9 territory, also known as the James Bay Treaty. It is the traditional territory of the Ojibwe/Chippewa, including the Mattagami First Nation, as well as the Mushkegowuk (Cree), Algonquin, and Métis Peoples.

MASTER OF COMPUTER SCIENCE | Tuition: \$24,147.90* (program)

Designed for graduates with a background in computer science, information technology, or related fields, this applied program builds advanced technical knowledge across software engineering, cybersecurity, data analytics, artificial intelligence, and IT systems. Students gain hands-on experience through coursework that prepares them for careers in today's fast-paced tech landscape.

Admission Requirements: To be considered for admission to the Master of Computer Science, applicants must hold a four-year Computer Science or related undergraduate degree from an accredited university, with a minimum 75% (B+) average over the last two years of full-time undergraduate study.

MASTER OF GLOBAL BUSINESS AND ECONOMY | Tuition: \$34,000.00* (program)

This course-based program is designed to equip students with the analytical, communication, and strategic thinking skills needed to succeed in the global marketplace. The curriculum explores real-world business challenges within an evolving economic context.

Admission Requirements: To be considered for admission to the Master of Global Business and Economy, applicants must hold a four-year undergraduate degree in any discipline from an accredited university, with a minimum 75% (B+) average over the last two years of full-time undergraduate study. Background in quantitative subjects is required for admission to this program.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ANALYTICS | Tuition: \$40,600.00* (program)

With a strong focus on data-driven decision-making, this program prepares students to thrive in today's analytics-driven economy. The course-based curriculum emphasizes data science, business intelligence, and applied analytics to support organizational growth and innovation.

Admission Requirements: To be considered for admission into the Master of Science in Business Analytics, applicants must hold a four-year Bachelor's degree in Mathematics, Sciences, Computer Science, Engineering, Economics, Business, or a related field from an accredited university, with a minimum 75% (B+) average in the last two years of full-time undergraduate study.

ALGOMA UNIVERSITY'S ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

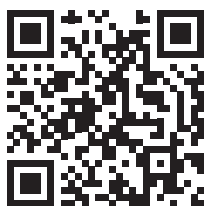
International students, entering their first year of full-time study in a Bachelor Degree program at Algoma University will be considered for an entrance scholarship. To be eligible for these prestigious awards, students must achieve a minimum academic result direct from high school, or on previous academic records if transferring from another university. No application is required.

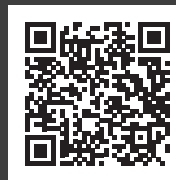
COMING SOON

The student residence will be designed to be a decolonized and Indigenized space in keeping with Algoma University's Special Mission, which fosters cross-cultural education between Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities.
